# Krebs Center for the Humanities: Workstream Status Report / November 2024

The Implementation Task Force (ITF) workstream for the Krebs Center for the Humanities held three meetings in November. Here's a summary of key developments:

## **November Meeting Highlights**

- 1. Krebs Humanities Scholars Program (Deliverable 1)
  - Program will start in Spring 2025
  - Faculty call for proposals issued with December 17 deadline
  - Up to five student positions are available
  - Faculty stipends established based on credit hours
  - Projects to utilize Krebs collection, HUMAN grant activities, or faculty research

### 2. Common Read Program (Deliverable 2)

- Mandatory program ruled out; opt-in version under consideration
- Davis to discuss with FIYS committee in early spring

### 3. Krebs Ambassador Program (Deliverable 3)

- We want to assess the possibility of recruiting from current admissions ambassadors
- Pending consultation with Admissions

# 4. Events and Programming

- Discussed opportunities for fine and performing arts departments
- Discussed potential plans for humanities department event proposals
- Discussed feasibility of future faculty trip to Italy to engage with Krebs materials (akin to a faculty trip to China 20 or so years ago).
